A home for siblings

The Rainbow Land Children's Hospice

The Rainbow Land Children's Hospice is a home for families with children facing a limited life expectancy because of an incurable illness or disability.

It is the siblings of children suffering from a life-limiting disease in particular who are to be supported and cared for by giving them the recognition and help they need. The hospice has also developed a resource-oriented sibling programme with lots of experiential and recreational educational elements. In addition to a variety of monthly sibling get-togethers, the Rainbow Land Children's Hospice organises a "Siblings' Weekend" once a year, where the goals and content of the siblings concept can be discussed and reinforced.



A word from the award-winner:

"Our 'secret' is that we focus entirely on the children's needs and put them centre-stage for that day. We listen to them attentively and concentrate on their resources. We take them as they are and give them our full and undivided attention."

"In addition to regular external supervision and weekly team meetings, the children's hospice is in constant contact with other institutions, such as out-patient children's hospice services, hospitals and social outreach centres. This promotes the exchange of innovative ideas on the subject of siblings from a wide variety of areas: sibling work is, after all, teamwork. Also, as part of the paediatric palliative care of siblings, parents are able to contact trained social workers at any time with their concerns. In the Rainbow Land Children's Hospice, the siblings are provided with someone they can trust and talk to, and can find new friends and support within a community."

For improved self-confidence and quality of life

The SisBroJekt - Children's Palliative Care Centre, Datteln



Moods and feelings can be acknowledged and expressed creatively in familiar surroundings.

SisBroJekt is a programme for healthy siblings of children with severe chronic diseases, cancer or disabilities at the Children's Palliative Care Centre of the Vestische Clinic for Children and Adolescents in Datteln.

On numerous siblings' days and weekends, the team heading the project offers an extensive programme which is composed of creative, musical and sporting elements thematically tailored to sibling children.

The main objective of the SisBroJekt is the prevention of physical and psy-

chological adjustment problems and maintenance of physical and mental health. The activities are also intended to improve the quality of life and raise the self-esteem of the siblings and to provide relief for the whole family.

Special praise from the jury of the FamilyTies Promotional Award:

"The SisBroJekt was initially only planned for five months but, due to its success and regular consultation with the children and parents, it has been continuously extended and further de-



veloped since its scientific evaluation in 2006. The SisBroJekt is integrated into both the FamilyTies network and the Sibling Children network of Lower Saxonyso that experiences can be shared and there can be networking on other projects. Further networking and opportunities for further cooperation are planned for the future. The siblings are able to exchange ideas among themselves or with the professional group leaders and get to know one another better, all in a safe, familiar environment. The positive experiences, so-

cial skills and greater self-confidencegained from the group experience are then translated into their daily lives."

A word from the award-winner: "Exchanging experiences with other experts and close consultations with the siblin children and their families mean that the project can be tailored precisely to the needs of children and adolescents. In the SisBroJekt they are given a secure space for themselves where they are able to check out what they are capable of and gain new experience. The fast, modern form of early diagnosis

"LARES Siblings" e-learning



9-year-old Emil is quiet and gets good grades at school but complains of headaches and non-specific abdominal pain. His sister Maria has trisomy 21. Emil's case is a practical example from the new "LARES Siblings" e-learning, which can be completed online as of now on the FamilyTies website. The LARES early detection questionnaire (LARES: gods of the household worshipped in ancient Rome) offers assistance in identifying the strain and the associated degree of suffering of siblings of children with a severe chronic illness or disbility and, where possible, in providing the child with specific assistance.

A number of questions usually arise before LARES is used

for the first time: When should the questionnaire be used? How do I address the issue with the family? How does the early diagnosis tool actually work? In order to answer these questions, FamilyTies has designed an e-learning program together with the ISPA which is not tied to a fixed place or time. This allows profession-



als from the health and social service sector to use this modern form of continuing education to learn how to complete and evaluate the LARES form quickly and in their own way.

Users can move freely within the LARES modules. Following general explanations on siblings topics and on the LAR-ES questionnaire, there are some practical examples, which give you the opportunity to try out the application of LARES in detail and to reflect upon its use. Additional networking and contact points as well as various links and downloads complete the program





Her extensive experience in the field of project management and communications not only for industrial enterprises but also for social welfare bodies means that Irene von Drigalski is well aware of the need to network with partners from the business and academic worlds.

"It is good to know that the FamilyTies Foundation will continue to provide support for sibling children and their parents in the long term, because whomever you ask, virtually everyone knows at least one person from their own family, circle of friends or working environment who is affected.
